



Wisconsin Safety and Health Hall of Fame Nomination Form

In 2001, the Wisconsin Safety Council established the Wisconsin Safety Hall of Fame to recognize high achievement and encourage progress toward a safer and healthier Wisconsin. It symbolizes the Council's commitment to safety and health. An individual is inaugurated into the Wisconsin Safety Hall of Fame annually. The Wisconsin Safety Hall of Fame is a tribute to professionals whose dedication, leadership and achievements have significantly impacted the safety and well-being of not only their employees, but Wisconsin as a whole, throughout the years.

Purposes of the Wisconsin Safety Hall of Fame

- To honor an individual whose appreciation of and concern for humanity, safety and health serves as an inspiration to others.
- To formally acknowledge the Wisconsin Safety Council's respect for consistent actions and achievements.
- To congratulate and thank an outstanding leader whose enlightened efforts on behalf of employees and community maintain society's commitment to the dignity of all people.
- To acknowledge an individual's achievement.

1) Top Manager Selection Criteria

The recipient is a chief executive officer (CEO), president, or other high-level operating official of an organization that has distinguished itself over a period of years for outstanding achievements in workplace and off-the-job safety and health, community service, environmental stewardship, and responsible citizenship.

To be considered for the Wisconsin Safety Hall of Fame, an organization and its leader should have a superior record in advancing safety and health practices within their organization and industry that is consistent with the stated purposes, objectives, and mission of the Wisconsin Safety Council. We wish to emphasize the need for organizations to clearly illustrate that each nominee demonstrates a very high lifetime standard of achievement or an outstanding effort to save a life.

This year's inductee will be announced May 17, 2011. The induction ceremony and banquet will be held during the Wisconsin Safety Council's Annual Congress and Exposition, Tuesday, May 17, 2011 at the Kalahari Resort and Convention Center, Wisconsin Dells, Wisconsin.

Criterion Support Information

The following format for supporting information will provide material vital to the Committee's considerations. The application will not be accepted if it does not follow the format listed below (on separate sheets of paper).

- 1. Summary of major accomplishments** — A brief summary to describe a candidate's major accomplishments in safety, health, and environment.
- 2. Innovative contributions** — Specific contributions for which the nomination is being presented, with reasons for perceived significance. (To effect a change; to do something in a new way; a new idea, method or device. Examples include: invention of the three-point safety belt, invention of the sprinkler system, development of safety program evaluation, etc.)
- 3. Research and writing** — Contributed significantly in the areas of research and/or publications. (Examples include: original research answering specific questions or contributing to amelioration of safety, health, or environmental problems. Publication of refereed articles in professional journals, publication of texts or books in these areas.)
- 4. Safety, Health, and/or Environmental Organizations Service and Leadership** — Provided service and leadership to one or more professional safety, health, or environmental organizations. (Examples of this include: serving as an officer or a board member, committee chair, executive director, etc.)
- 5. Application results** — Has achieved significant results in the reduction of death and injury due to accidents or occupational disease by applying new knowledge and techniques on an ongoing basis. (Examples include: development of safety programs, devices, and subsequent utilization of those in safety programming.)
